



Masterclasses: Physical Health Skills for Mental Health and Learning Disabilities Practitioners

Research has highlighted that mental health and learning disability practitioners need to update their knowledge and clinical skills regarding the physical health needs of people diagnosed with a learning disability or mental illness. It is essential that practitioners are able to assess a patient's condition and undertake appropriate interventions, in order to help the patient manage their own wellbeing.

The University of Huddersfield is running a series of interactive Masterclasses which aim to improve the knowledge and skills of mental health and learning disability practitioners. These Masterclasses have been specifically designed to increase your awareness of evidence-based interventions appropriate for each condition.

The Masterclasses will be held throughout June and July 2014. They will be led by speakers who are experts in each specific Masterclass area and will cover:

- Health improvement profile tool
- Intramuscular injections
- Oral health
- Epilepsy
- Diabetes
- Wound care
- Alternative therapies
